Feinstein Challenge

The year 2013 marks the 16th annual challenge from Alan Shawn Feinstein to alleviate hunger across the country. Each year Mr. Feinstein offers a contribution based on the amount of money raised and food items donated during the March 1 to April 30 time period. As part of this challenge, food items will credited at \$1 per item. The Feinstein Foundation awards \$1 million proportionally across the country with grants ranging in size from \$250 to a maximum of \$35,000. Donations must be received during the campaign period. We have set a goal of \$75,000 in gifts and food items combined.

For us at EFPN, this fund-raising period is second only to the end-of-year giving. Please consider giving at this time. Donations toward any of our food programs will qualify for the match campaign. Results are reported immediately in May and a grant is awarded in August. Check our website to watch our progress to our Feinstein Challenge goal.

Network Receives First Distribution from Kroger Stores Community Rewards Program

EFPN received our first proceeds from the Kroger Community Rewards program. Twenty-nine households have now registered for this program which will send \$137.36 to the Network for the last quarter's activity. Proceeds go to support our efforts to reduce hunger in Midland County.

How does it work? Choose EFPN when you register your Kroger card, and you will be donating to EFPN every time you shop with no additional cost to you. Kroger will donate a percentage of your qualifying purchases back to EFPN. Supporters can earn rewards for EFPN on almost everything every time you shop! However, there are specific purchases that cannot be included: alcohol, tobacco, government-assisted pharmacy expenses, postage stamps, Kroger gift cards and Green Dot Prepaid Cards, gift certificates, bottle deposits, lottery and promotional tickets, fuel, fuel center purchases, office services, and sales tax. Eligible pharmacy purchases include out-of-pocket co-pays for non-government-assisted pharmacy programs.

Year-End Results are Fantastic!

Over \$216,000 was received through the Network to support the Programs of the EFPN in fiscal year 2012, with over \$90,000 in November and December alone! The board set the budget for fiscal year 2013, and below is a listing of our key programs and budget expenses:

- \$54,000 for the Backpack Buddies Program to feed at current enrollment 730 kids for 31 weekends during the school year will provide over 135,000 meals through the school year.
- \$70,000 budgeted for food purchases to supplement donated items. This use of donations when combined with donated food items will support 2,400 families in addition to the 1,000 families supported through the HELP Pantry.
- \$20,000 allocated to provide each client family with a \$10 gift certificate for use to buy perishable food items we can't always stock at the pantries (like milk, eggs and meat).
- \$7,000 is being budgeted to hold 8 mobile food pantries. If we average 250 households per MFP, this will provide food assistance to 2,000 families during the year.
- \$36,000 toward supplemental nutrition items as part of our partnership with Cancer Services and some limited incontinence supplies to support clients of Senior Services.
- \$10,000 to partner with Aldersgate United Methodist Church to deliver a Thanksgiving Basket program for 450 families (with the primary expense being gift certificates to help acquire a turkey).
- \$40,000 for a part-time manager, client coordinator, substitute, and general administrative costs (about 10% of the annual expenses).
