# The Need for Food is Increasing

A homeless family in need of food, grandparents suddenly responsible for their grandchildren, a father of a family living on the edge loses his job, a mom leaves a shelter to move into a new home, a throat cancer patient needs a nutritional supplement, and a child helps feed her family over the weekend with a backpack of food. These are some of the people your food and money donations are supporting. These residents of Midland County are coming to EFPN in increasing numbers putting a strain on the EFPN budget. Our Backpack Buddies program has experienced a 14% increase for the 2019-2020 school year. We have exceeded our 2019 nutritional supplement budget even though we increased it from last year. The majority of calls from 211 for food are directed

to EFPN. Last year we distributed 17,000 items of food each month through our eight pantries. This year we are projecting the number may be greater. We have been able to keep up with these demands because of your past generous support. We want to ensure we can continue to support those in need of food so we need your continued support. We are honored that you have placed your trust in EFPN in the past to make wise use of your donations. Please remember the food insecure this coming holiday season and allow us to use your food and monetary donations to help them. We are grateful to an anonymous donor who funded the "People Helping People" mural, shown above, on the side of our building. You are the people helping those that are food insecure.

# Reflections

A young minimum wage working couple was waiting for their SNAP benefits to start. Their "extra" money was being used for formula and diapers for their baby. After receiving a food order, they were overwhelmed with gratitude and wanted to pay us back. Our coordinator told them to pay it forward when they get on their feet.

A young family has to travel to Ann Arbor for their sick child. The prognosis is good as treatments continue. They have been using their food stamps to get by. As the child gets better and begins to eat more, the food stamps are getting depleted so we are helping them.

A family lost their home to foreclosure. They went to a hotel and had no food. We provided them an emergency box and an order of food. They wanted to repay us but we told them this is what we do because of the generous support the community gives us.

# **Community Thanksgiving Food Collection**



Thanksgiving is a time to be grateful for all that we have. It is also a time to remember those who struggle to food on their table. On November 24, resources from the Midland community will come together to provide 500 families with a Thanksgiving meal. This program is a partnership of Al-

dersgate United Methodist Church, EFPN and the Midland County Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS). The list of recipients is compiled with input from DHHS, EFPN and many of the nonprofit agencies in Midland County. To contribute to this Thanksgiving program you may bring your nonperishable food items and personal care items on Sunday, November 24, between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm to Aldersgate United Methodist Church at 2206 Airfield Lane. Many churches, schools and businesses in our community are collecting food for this event. If you cannot make it to Aldersgate on November 24, you may call 600-8989 to plan another time to deliver your donations or to arrange a pickup of your donations.

#### What is Needed

**Food Needs:** Canned fruits, vegetables and soup. cereal, spaghetti sauce, noodle, boxed potatoes, rice, dessert mixes, juices, stuffing, Jell-O, pie mixes

**Personal Care Needs:** Shampoo, bar soap, deodorant, combs, hair brushes. razor/shaving cream, toilet paper, tooth paste, tooth brushes, laundry detergent

**Cookies:** Donations of cookies (labeled and packaged, a dozen per package in sealed plastic bags) would be especially appreciated. At least 500 dozen of cookies are needed.

Cash Donations: We need over \$10,000 in cash donations to give recipients gift certificates which the families use to purchase perishable foods. Your check should be made payable to: Midland County EFPN, P.O. Box 2521, Midland, MI 48641-2521. Please designate your donation as Thanksgiving Baskets.

This quote by W. Clement Stone, a businessman and philanthropist, reminds us of the true meaning of this holiday- "If you are really thankful, what do you do? You share." As you buy items for your Thanksgiving meal, please remember those who cannot afford food for their Thanksgiving table.

#### **Sharing Tree Provides Special Gifts**

EFPN will be participating in the Sharing Tree Program. This program requires that all of our Red Tag requests be gift cards. Red Tags will be on trees located throughout Midland. EFPN's requests include grocery gift cards to allow families to have extra special meals. We are asking for restaurant gift cards so that our recipients can have a treat to eat out at a restaurant. We are also asking for gift cards to purchase kitchen supplies. Many of the people who come to a pantry lack some basic kitchen items like can openers, pots and pans and baking pans. The Sharing Tree has been very valuable in allowing us to make Christmas and the time beyond the holidays extraordinary for our recipients. On a past Christmas Eve, one of our pantries debated whether to be open on Christmas Eve. They decided to open. A family came to this pantry on Christmas Eve. They selected their food and were given a very generous Meijer's gift card that had been given to EFPN from the Sharing Tree Program. The family had not had the money to buy presents for their children. Because of this gift card, they planned to get some presents for their children. Please support the Sharing



EFPN is part of the Kroger's Community Rewards program. Choose EFPN when you register your Kroger Card and you will be

donating to EFPN every time you shop with no additional cost to you. Kroger will donate a percentage of your qualifying purchases back to EFPN. Supporters can earn rewards for EFPN on almost everything. However, there are specific purchases that cannot be included: alcohol, tobacco, and gift cards. The EFPN Kroger Non Profit Organization Number is BD353. If a you do not yet have a Kroger Plus card, they are available at the customer service desk at any Kroger. Sign-up requires access to the Internet. If you do not have Internet access, contact us at 486-9393 and we can sign up your card. You no longer have to re-enroll your card every year.
