2023 was a pivotal year for our organization. We celebrated our 40th anniversary and finalized a strategic plan to help position us for the next 40 years. As we reflect, 2023 was marked by resilience, growth, and unwavering commitment to our mission. The Midland County Food Assistance Network (MCFAN) has faced extraordinary challenges and emerged stronger, ready to serve our community for many decades to come.

Over the past few years, we have navigated significant events that tested our resiliency and our capacity. The pandemic and the ongoing impacts of COVID-19, and the devastating flood affected our operations and the lives of those we serve here in Midland County. MCFAN adapted swiftly, ensuring that safety protocols were in place while maintaining the essential services our community relies on.

Amid these external challenges, we underwent a name change and a transition in leadership. These changes have revitalized our organization, bringing fresh perspectives and renewed energy to our mission, "Always Food in Every Home."

The mission of ensuring food in every home is more than just a statement; it's a commitment that requires dedication, resources, and empathy. Behind the scenes, countless volunteer hours, collaboration efforts, and resources are poured into making this mission a reality. The concept of "every home" encompasses a vast array of diverse situations and needs. Recognizing and addressing these differences is an important aspect of MCFAN's programs which aim to meet the unique requirements of various families. The success of these programs is a testament to the dedication and compassion MCFAN to ensure that no household is left behind.

2023 was a remarkable year, marked by numerous achievements that show our commitment to combating food insecurity, while instating our strategic plan for 2023-2025.

#### The impact is clear:

- 5,950 households benefited from our support through 8 pantries, distributing 191,189 items.
- 9,139 households were served through our mobile food pantries with a total distribution of 628,468 pounds of food.
- 780 children in Midland County School District received food through the backpack buddy program.
- Through the Regrow program, in partnership with United Way, we delivered **8,600** meals, demonstrating our dedication to a holistic approach in addressing the needs of our community.

These numbers are more than just statistics—they represent the lives touched and the difference made through our collective efforts.

#### Many of our programs also saw expansions:

The **Regrow program**'s initial goal of repurposing food for meals 1-2 times a year grew to providing meals monthly. This growth reflects the dedication and collaborative spirit of the organizations involved, including United Way, Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, MCFAN, Hidden Harvest, Midland Business Alliance, Phoenix Farms, Windover, and The Arnold Center.

Expanding the **snack program** to cover all middle schools and high schools in Midland County is a significant achievement and a testament to MCFAN's commitment to addressing the needs of students in the community. By establishing relationships with counselors, MCFAN gained valuable insights into the necessity of such programs and the specific needs of the students.

In 2024, we are committed to building on the momentum we've established this past year, guided by our strategic plan and its three pivotal pillars.

- *Pillar 1:* Organizational Excellence we will focus on evaluating and enhancing our staff and board structure to ensure we are operating at our highest potential.
- *Pillar 2*: Programs and Services this pillar emphasizes a thorough assessment of community needs, ensuring our programs are not only aligned with these needs but are also impactful and relevant.
- *Pillar 3*: Resource Optimization we will assess our donor database, optimizing how we utilize the resources entrusted to us.

By concentrating on these three pillars, we ensure that our organization is not only effective but also efficient in serving our clients and maximizing the impact of every donor dollar. This approach positions us to continue making meaningful strides in the year ahead.
