## **Name Change**

Midland County Emergency Food Assistance Network (MCFAN) (formerly EFPN) changed its name to reflect its full portfolio of programs which address more than emergency food needs here in Midland County.

In 2023 our organization, celebrated its 40th anniversary. MCFAN was founded as a collective of food pantries throughout Midland County aimed to deliver on the mission – always food in every home. Today, the organization has eight pantry locations and also provides community food assistance through numerous programs such as Backpack Buddies for preschool and elementary youth, snack programs for middle and high schools, elderly food assistance, a nutrition supplement program and mobile food pantries. The new name – Midland County Food Assistance Network (MCFAN for short) removes the word emergency, an important distinction.



"Changing our name to reflect what we do was an important decision," said Kim Birch, President of MCFAN. "We provide food assistance through many programs that are nonemergent, but nevertheless critical to our community. Expanding our name beyond emergency food pantries better communicates what we are really all about."

## **NEW MANAGING DIRECTOR**

MCFAN also announces Terrah Johnson as the new managing director for the organization. In line with a newly launched strategic plan which focuses on organizational efficiency, optimizing programs and services, and using organization resources effectively, the MCFAN Board of Directors saw a need for additional organizational leadership and are happy to announce Johnson who brings strong leadership experience.

"Terrah is a great fit for our organization," said Birch. "She has a history working with us through her previous roles and knows the value and impact of food security on our community. As we look to continue tackling food insecurity in partnership with various other nonprofit organizations, Terrah will help us deliver on our strategic goals.

## Canstruction

Canstruction Midland was held November 12, 2023. Nine teams of students competed in the Canstruction Midland event: Bullock Creek High School, Christian Home Educators of Midland, H.H. Dow High School, Jefferson Middle School, Meridian Early College High School, Midland High School, Northeast Middle School, St. John's Lutheran School and Windover High School. Together, they used more than 12,000 cans to create their Michigan themed structures.

Canstruction is a nationwide charitable competition that involves building sculptures with canned food items. The event was hosted locally by the Midland Mall, Midland Public Schools and the Midland County Food Assistance Network (MCFAN). The event received generous community support and was well attended at the Midland Mall.

The competition's goal is to raise awareness of food insecurity in Midland County. According to United Way, 33% of households in Midland County struggle to meet basic needs, which might force a choice between paying bills or purchasing food. The net proceeds of the Canstruction Midland event will help support MCFAN's vision of "always food in every home."

# NEW SNACK PROGRAM

In partnership with the local middle and high schools, MCFAN is helping to address hunger in schools. When teachers began to see students acting out and or feeling sluggish, they noticed it was due to food insecurity. Through donations, MCFAN is able to provide snacks to 8 local middle and high schools for the 2023-2024 school year. There is no cost to participate in the program. Middle School and High School age students are able to receive snacks to keep them energized throughout the day.

## **BACKPACK BUDDY**



In cooperation with the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, MCFAN is offering the BackPack Buddy program for the 2023-2024 school year. Elementary and preschool children are eligible to participate if they qualify for free or reduced meals, live in a household with a Food Stamp FIP case number or in a household qualifying for WIC assistance.

There is no cost to participate in the program.

To enroll in the program, parents should contact the administration of their child's school for an enrollment form.
